The Great Litany

The Litany is the oldest English language liturgy in the Anglican tradition. While composition of this particular service was occasioned by the King's concern to win his wars against Scotland and France, it is very much a part of the tradition of sung petitions that date back as far as our Jewish roots. In the liturgy this morning, the Litany is the principle intercession.

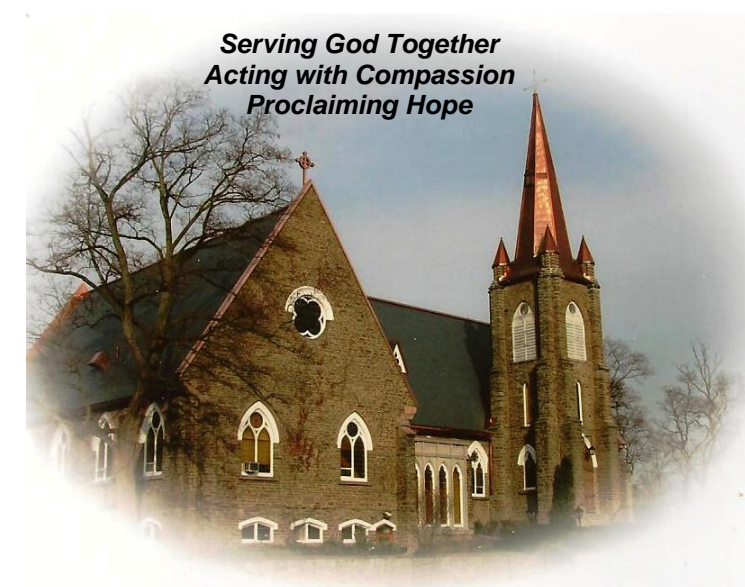
