Retirement of the Rev. Clement Carelse: As you may be aware, Rev. Clement Carelse announced his well-deserved retirement in May 2020 after a 12+ year music director career at St. Peter's Erindale. He had been planning to take on an exciting new post-retirement music adventure at St. Peter's Cathedral in Charlottetown, PEI. Due to COVID-19, this opportunity was postponed and Clem generously agreed to continue his music directorship on a part-time basis for the past 18 months. We have been thankful for Clem's presence and music ministry during these difficult times, under a multitude of restrictions and technology challenges.

Clem will now officially be starting his new post in mid-April. We hope to put a team in place in early spring to commence work to recruit a new music director. It is our intention that the hiring of a music director will follow the Bishop's appointment of a new incumbent so that our new incumbent is involved in the process (our new incumbent and music director must work closely together!).

We wanted to let you know that we've put plans in place to carry on our music ministry at St. Peter's with an interim team effective February 1, 2022. Lori Dolloff has agreed to take on the leadership of our choir and Lori & Mark Matterson have kindly agreed to share the music director role until Fall 2022 (by which time we hope to have a new choir/music director in place). We are also blessed to have Mark Matterson continuing to serve as Handbell Choir Director.

We would like to honour Clem's legacy at our parish with a celebration of his music ministry on Sunday, January 30, 2022 after the 10:00 am service. If you would like to be part of this event planning team, please contact Ken Baxter at kenb@nor-del.com.

Please note the special times for our services on January 30th which will be at 8 am and 10 am and that the Rev. Deacon Clem Carelse will be the homilist at both services.

Since the pandemic began, Belinda Morrow and the volunteers at the Deacon's Cupboard have done an amazing job putting practices in place to keep both the guests and the volunteers safe.

If anyone comes into the church to perform an essential function that cannot be done off-site, masks must be worn, and all other pandemic protocols observed. Lesson 1 Corinthians 12:1-11

Reader: The Lesson is written in the 12th chapter of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, beginning at the 1st verse.

Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak. Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues.

All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

Reader: Here endeth the Lesson.

Gospel **John 2:1-11**

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel is written in the 2nd chapter of the Gospel according to St. John, beginning at the 1st verse.

People: **Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
