The PSC also invites everyone in the St. Peter's community to take part in filling out our **Parish Survey**. The results of this survey will be used to compose our Parish Profile that will be presented to potential candidates for the position of Incumbent here at our Parish.

We have 2 surveys: One for youth and adults that is to be filled out individually and should take about 30 minutes. The second is one for the children (ages 0-12) in our parish and should only take 5-10 minutes. A paper version of the Youth and Adult survey will be mailed out at the end of November if you would prefer to fill it out in hard copy.

Attention all Choristers! The Diocese of Toronto is now permitting choral practice and singing at church services and we are overjoyed to have an opportunity to bring choral music back to our parish! We have 3 options for choir participation at this time:

1. Due to space constraints in the chancel, a small group of choristers (4) may sing at in-person services.
2. In person choir practices may resume, resulting in a recorded performance.
3. We can distribute recorded music to choir members so that each can personally record their voice, to be consolidated in one mixed soundtrack.

To participate in an "in person" choir practice or performance, the choir member is required to provide proof of 2nd vaccination, be masked, and be physically distanced from other members by a minimum of 2 metres, preferably 3. Choir practices must be held in a well-ventilated space and not exceed 90 minutes in length. Self-screening and attendance must be taken for contact tracing purposes.

Unfortunately, congregational singing is not permitted for the time being.

Eucharistic Prayer

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant: We give you thanks and praise, almighty God, through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word, through whom you have created all things.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh of the Virgin Mary and shared our human nature. He lived and died as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

Celebrant: In fulfilment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering, to bring release to those who place their hope in you; and so he won for you a holy people.

He chose to bear our griefs and sorrows, and to give up his life on the cross, that he might shatter the chains of evil and death, and banish the darkness of sin and despair. By his resurrection he brings us into the light of your presence.

Celebrant: Holy and gracious God, accept our praise, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ; who on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, took bread and gave you thanks, saying, "Take, and eat: this is my body which is broken for you."

In the same way he took the cup, saying, "This is my blood which is shed for you. When you do this, you do it in memory of me."

Celebrant: Remembering, therefore, his death and resurrection, we offer you this bread and this cup, giving thanks that you have made us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you.

We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of your holy Church. Gather into one all who share in these sacred mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory through your Servant, Jesus Christ.

All glory and honour are yours, Father and Son, with the Holy Spirit in the holy Church, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant: As our Saviour taught us, let us pray.

**All: OUR Father who art in heaven,
Hallowed be thy Name,
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
And forgive us our trespasses,
As we forgive those who trespass against us;
And lead us not into temptation,

Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

People: We, being many, are one body, for we all share in the one bread.

Communion

Celebrant: Communion will be bread only. Please stay where you are and communion will be brought to you. If you do not wish to receive communion, just cross your arms over your chest. While you are waiting, please sanitize your hands. You will find sanitizer at either end of the pews on the seat. I will begin at the back and make my way to the front. Please wait until the person distributing communion has moved to the next row before removing your mask and consuming the host. Put your mask back on after you have received communion, then sanitize your hands again. Once you have used the hand sanitizer, please return it to where you found it so it's there for the next service.

For those who cannot or do not wish to receive the physical bread, but wish to make a spiritual communion, I invite you to say these words with me:

Prayer for Spiritual Communion

All: Jesus, I believe that you are present with us in the sacrament of bread and wine. I love you and I desire your presence afresh in my life. Since I cannot now receive the bread and wine of the altar, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you and unite myself to you; never let me be separated from you. Amen.

Celebrant: The gifts of God for the People of God.

People: **Thanks be to God.**

(Celebrant distributes communion, starting from the BACK of the church and moving toward the front, back and forth through the pews.)

Prayer after Communion

Celebrant: Almighty God,
you have made us a royal priesthood
in the kingdom of your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Make known his victory through us, we pray,
that all the world may see his light.
We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Doxology

Celebrant: Glory to God,

**All: whose power, working in us, can do infinitely more than
we can ask or imagine.
Glory to God from generation to generation,
in the Church and in Christ Jesus, for ever and ever.
Amen.**

Dismissal

Celebrant: Go in peace to love and serve the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.
