EARTH DAY - APRIL 22, 2018



Residents of Capetown South Africa queuing for daily water rations, Halifax city planners trying to save their waterfront developments from the ravages of rising ocean levels, and North American cities being devastated by winter “bomb cyclones”. These are current news headlines due to decades of carelessness with our earth’s resources and the resultant global climate warming. We know there are things each one of us can do on a daily basis to help look after our planet: be aware of and reduce our water consumption; use LED lights and energy efficient appliances to reduce energy consumption; recycle and compost as much waste as possible. But did you know that one of the greatest threats to the survival of our planet and every living being is plastic pollution?
