### **Land Acknowledgement**

We acknowledge that St. Peter's, Erindale is built on the Territory of the Mississauga's of the Credit First Nation, the Anishnawbe (ah-nish-nah-bay) Nation, the Haudenosaunee (ho-din-oh-show-neigh) Confederacy, and the Wendat (when-dot) Nation. ## **The Proclamation of the Word**

**Lesson: Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16** (*read by baptism family*)

Reader: A reading from Hebrews.

Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. Indeed, by faith our ancestors received approval. By faith we understand that the worlds were prepared by the word of God, so that what is seen was made from things that are not visible.

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.

By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person, and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, ‘as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.’

All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

**Gospel Luke 12:32-40**

Gospeller: The Lord be with you.

**People: And also with you.**

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

**People: Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

‘Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father’s good pleasure to give you the kingdom. Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailling treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

‘Be dressed for action and have your lamps lit; be like those who are waiting for their master to return from the wedding banquet, so that they may open the door for him as soon as he comes and knocks. Blessed are those slaves whom the master finds alert when he comes; truly I tell you, he will fasten his belt and have them sit down to eat, and he will come and serve them. If he comes during the middle of the night, or near dawn, and finds them so, blessed are those slaves.

‘But know this: if the owner of the house had known at what hour the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour.’

Gospeller: The Gospel of Christ.

**People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

## **Presentation and Examination of the Candidates**

Celebrant: The candidates for Holy Baptism will now be presented.

*The candidates are presented individually from their pews.*

### ***For Infants & Younger Children***

**Parents and sponsors: I present (*Name*) to receive the sacrament of baptism.**

*When all have been presented the celebrant asks the parents and sponsors,*

Celebrant: Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?

**Parents and sponsors: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow into the full stature of Christ?

**Parents and sponsors: I will, with God's help.**

### ***Adults and Older Children***

**Sponsor: I present (*Name*) to receive the sacrament of baptism**

*The celebrant asks each candidate when presented*

Celebrant: Do you desire to be baptized?

**Candidate: I do**

### **Questions**

*Then the celebrant asks the following questions of the parents and sponsors.*

Question: Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

Question: Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

Question: Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

**Answer: I renounce them.**

Question: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

**Answer: I do.**

Question: Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

**Answer: I do.**

Question: Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

**Answer: I do.**

*Then the celebrant addresses the congregation, saying,*

Celebrant: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support *these persons* in *their* life in Christ?

**People: We will.**

### **Prayers for the Candidates**

*The celebrant then says to the congregation,*

Celebrant: Let us now pray for *these persons* who *are* to receive the sacrament of new birth.

*(Led by celebrant OR a member of one of the baptism families)*

Leader: Deliver *them*, O Lord, from the way of sin and death.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Open *their hearts* to your grace and truth.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Fill *them* with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Teach *them* to love others in the power of the Spirit.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Send *them* into the world in witness to your love.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Bring *them* to the fullness of your peace and glory.

**People: Lord, hear our prayer.**

Leader: Grant, O Lord,  
that all who are baptized  
into the death of Jesus Christ your Son  
may live in the power of his resurrection  
and look for him to come again in glory;  
who lives and reigns now and for ever. **Amen.**

## **The Celebration of Baptism**

### **Thanksgiving over the Water**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

**People: And also with you.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water.  
Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the  
beginning of creation.  
Through water you led the children of Israel out of their  
bondage in Egypt into the land of promise.  
In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John  
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the  
Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection,  
from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

Celebrant: We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.  
In it we are buried with Christ in his death.  
By it we share in his resurrection.  
Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.  
Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into  
his fellowship those who come to him in faith,  
baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit.

Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit,  
that those who are here cleansed from sin and born  
again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus  
Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit,  
be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

**People: Amen.**

Celebrant: Let us join with those who are committing themselves to  
Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

## **The Baptismal Covenant**

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

**People: I believe in God, The Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

**People: I believe in Jesus Christ,  
his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.**

**People: On the third day he rose again.  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again  
to judge the living and the dead.**

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

**People: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic  
Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of  
sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life  
everlasting.**

Celebrant: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,  
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

**People: I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall  
into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

**People**     **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

**People:**     **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

**People:**     **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

**People:**     **I will, with God's help.**

Celebrant: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation, and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

**People:**     **I will, with God's help.**

## **The Baptism**

*One family at a time will come to the font. Each candidate is presented by name to the celebrant, who pours water upon the candidate, saying,*

Celebrant: *(Name)*, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

*The celebrant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each one saying to each,*

Celebrant: I sign you with the cross,  
and mark you as Christ's own forever.

## **The Giving of the Light**

*One of the godparents (or the celebrant) will light the baptismal candle from the paschal candle and presents it to the family saying,*

Godparent: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

**People: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.**

*The newly baptized and their family return to their seat.*

*Once all are baptized, the celebrant, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying,*

Celebrant: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon *these* your *servants* the forgiveness of sin, and have raised *them* to the new life of grace. Sustain *them*, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give *them* inquiring and discerning hearts, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Celebrant: Let us welcome the newly baptized.

**People: We receive you into the household of God. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.**

Celebrant: Father,  
receive all we offer you this day,  
and grant that in this eucharist  
we may be enriched by the gifts of the Spirit.  
We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

**People: Amen.**

## **Eucharistic Prayer 3**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

**People: And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

**People: We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

Celebrant: Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; we give you thanks and praise, because, in the mystery you disclose to us, you reveal your glory as the glory of your Son and the Holy Spirit: three persons equal in majesty, undivided in splendour, yet one Lord, one God, ever to be adored in your everlasting glory.

Celebrant: Therefore with all the company of heaven we raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.

**All: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

**Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

Celebrant: We give thanks to you, Lord our God, for the goodness and love you have made known to us in creation; in calling Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Saviour and Redeemer of the world. In him you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In

him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, a death he freely accepted, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, 'Take, eat: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.'

Celebrant: After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, 'Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.'

**All:** Therefore, Father, according to his command,  
**we remember his death,**  
**we proclaim his resurrection,**  
**we await his coming in glory;**

Celebrant: and we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts, that they may be the sacrament of the body of Christ and his blood of the new covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we, made acceptable in him, may be sanctified by the Holy Spirit.

In the fullness of time, reconcile all things in Christ, and make them new, and bring us to that city of light where you dwell with all your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation; by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, almighty Father, now and for ever.

**People: Amen.**

### **Lord's Prayer**

Celebrant: As our Saviour taught us, let us pray,

**All: Our Father who art in heaven,  
Hallowed be thy Name,  
Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread;  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
As we forgive those who trespass against us;  
And lead us not into temptation,  
But deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory,  
for ever and ever. Amen.**

### **Breaking of the Bread**

Celebrant: We break this bread to share in the body of Christ.

**All: We, being many, are one body,  
for we all share in the one bread..**

Celebrant: The gifts of God for the People of God.

**People: Thanks be to God.**

## **Communion**

*(You are welcome to receive Communion. Communion will be bread only. Please come up the centre aisle and return via the side aisles. Please keep your mask on until you have moved away from the person distributing the host. If you wish a blessing instead, please indicate this by crossing your arms over your chest).*

Celebrant: For those who cannot or do not wish to receive the physical bread, but wish to make a spiritual communion, I invite you to say these words with me:

## **Prayer for Spiritual Communion**

Jesus, I believe that you are present with us in the sacrament of bread and wine. I love you and I desire your presence afresh in my life. Since I cannot now receive the bread and wine of the altar, come spiritually into my heart. I embrace you and unite myself to you; never let me be separated from you. Amen.
